Old Business:

WHEREAS, Proposal 1 which authorizes the use of recreational marihuana was adopted by the voters at the November 6, 2018 General Election, and

WHEREAS, various regulations will be promulgated by the State of Michigan which regulates activities which are allowed pursuant to Proposal 1, and

WHEREAS, local municipalities under Proposal 1 are afforded the option to opt out of allowing recreational marihuana facilities to be established in the municipality, and

WHEREAS, this action is intended to exercise the powers of the City of Gladwin under Section 6.1 of the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act, and

WHEREAS, the City of Gladwin, by its City Council, considers it to be in the interest of the City to make such election at this time,

NOW THEREFORE, the City of Gladwin ordains:

Ordinance No. 340

An Ordinance for the Registration of Recreational Marihuana Facilities

Section 1. This Ordinance may be referred to as the Gladwin City Opt Out Ordinance.

Section 2. No recreational marihuana facility shall be established or operated within the jurisdiction of the City of Gladwin.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days following adoption, as provided in the Charter of the City of Gladwin.

Motion by Council Member Darlington, seconded by Council Member Bodnar to approve the City of Gladwin Administrator to sign the Michigan work Northern Michigan Opioid Alliance form. All ayes. Motion carried.
