The Regular Meeting of the Gladwin City Council was called to order by Mayor Darlene Jungman at 5:00 p.m.

Mayor Jungman led the Pledge of Allegiance and Pastor Bradstreet gave the invocation.

Motion by Council Member Caffrey, seconded by Council Member Darlington to approve the minutes from the June 03, 2019 for the regular City Council meeting as presented. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Council Member Kile, seconded by Council Member Crawford to approve warrant #19-035 in the amount of \$71,544.41 and payroll for the period ending June 02, 2019 in the amount of \$66,935.53. All ayes. Motion carried.

County Commissioner Taylor stated that they had a good meeting at the Airport and went over the budget.

New Business:

Motion by Council Member Caffrey, seconded by Council Member Smith to approve the purchase order #19-1026 for Mid-Michigan Asphalt in the amount of \$5,784.00 to be paid out of 591-536-930-000. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Council Member Darlington, seconded by Council Member Caffrey to approve the reappointments to the Zoning Board of Appeals – Art Ademac and Lori Stout terms expiring July of 2022. All ayes. Motion carried.

Nancy Pnacek was present on behalf of DAR (Daughters of American Revolution) Gladwin/Midland Chapter and she explained what they do.

The Mayor read the Proclamation and declared the week of September 17th – 23rd to be Constitution week.

Council Member Bodnar stated that she attended the Dance Recital and really enjoyed it. She stated that there are some dead trees that need to be taken care of on South Silverleaf and Columbus Street.

Council Member Smith would like to extend his condolences to Council Member Bodnar for the loss of her mother and stated that he had bears on his porch at his home raiding his sunflower seeds.

Council Member Crawford stated he was surprised that the Dance Studio was not part of the Rising Tide since it is such a big part of the community.

Council Member Darlington stated she seen that the sign ordinance is being followed and that signs are getting removed and want to say how nice the old Greer building looked.

Administrator Shannon stated that Doug Strayer has Patriotic Sports open and if you get a chance to stop in and see him.

He would like to see the sidewalk replacement program get back on track and if you see a sidewalk that needs to be replaced to please let him know.

The WWTP has an old generator and tried to go out for bids on it and no offers were made so he would like to donate it to Bob North of the Emergency management and draft an agreement up regarding it.
